# Founder's Foreword

---

Dry Bones Church exists because I carry a deep and unshakable conviction: faith must be put into action, no life is beyond redemption, nothing in a person's story is wasted, and what seems dead can live again.

I believe revival is real.

I believe freedom through Christ is real.

And I believe the Church has a responsibility to create places where people can actually heal, grow, and live whole lives — not just survive week to week.

This church was not built quickly.

It was built with intention.

With clarity.

With years in the making.

And with a clear vision of what kind of spaces and environments people truly need if revival is going to last.

The heart behind Dry Bones Church is simple: to build a faithful church that carries the weight when life gets heavy.

A church strong enough to hold people when things fall apart.

A church where leadership is clear, mercy is real, worship is intimate, and faith is lived daily — not just talked about.

That vision didn't come from theory.

It came from life experience.

I pushed myself through intense pressure, corrupt leadership environments, and so many emotionally demanding situations that tested every part of me.

I hit rock bottom more than once in my life.

There were times that I didn't want to keep living.

My heart had hardened to a depth I never believed could be redeemed.

I know what it's like to feel numb and dead inside.

And I also know what it's like to be rebuilt, restored, and revived.

Christ met me there — not with shallow answers, but with wisdom, discipline, and truth.

I was transformed in a way that made returning to my old life impossible.

It was more than change — it was a new life.

He gave me a clear vision and a path forward.

Not perfect.

Not easy.

But free.

He taught me how to build a life rooted in purpose, clarity, and strength.

And He placed an enduring fire in me — a fire to live free and help others find the same freedom and purpose I was given.
